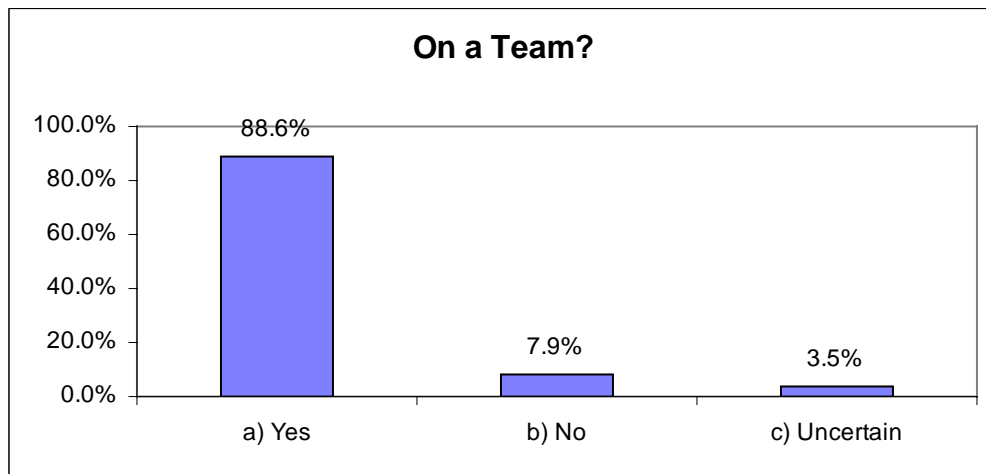


An Analysis of High-Technology Project Teams in the San Francisco Bay Area

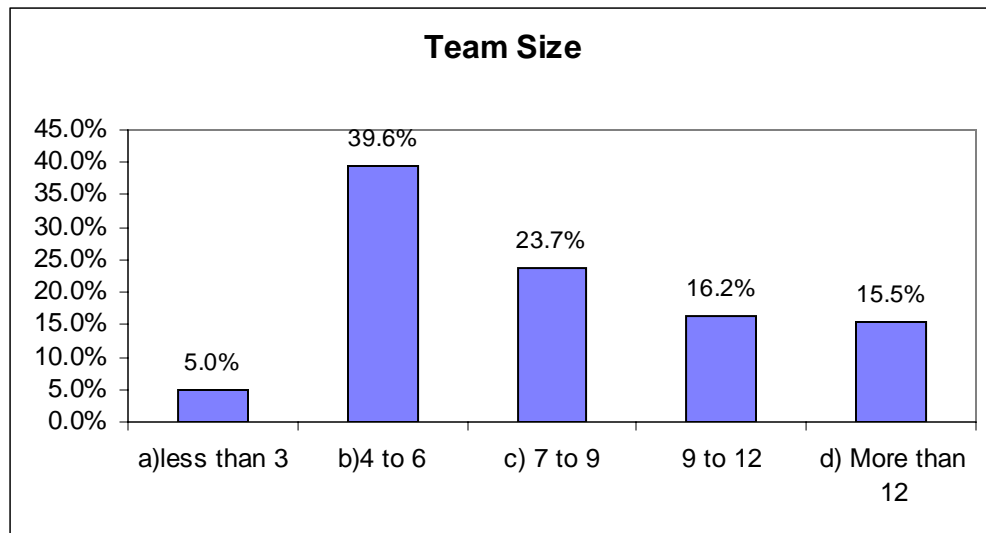

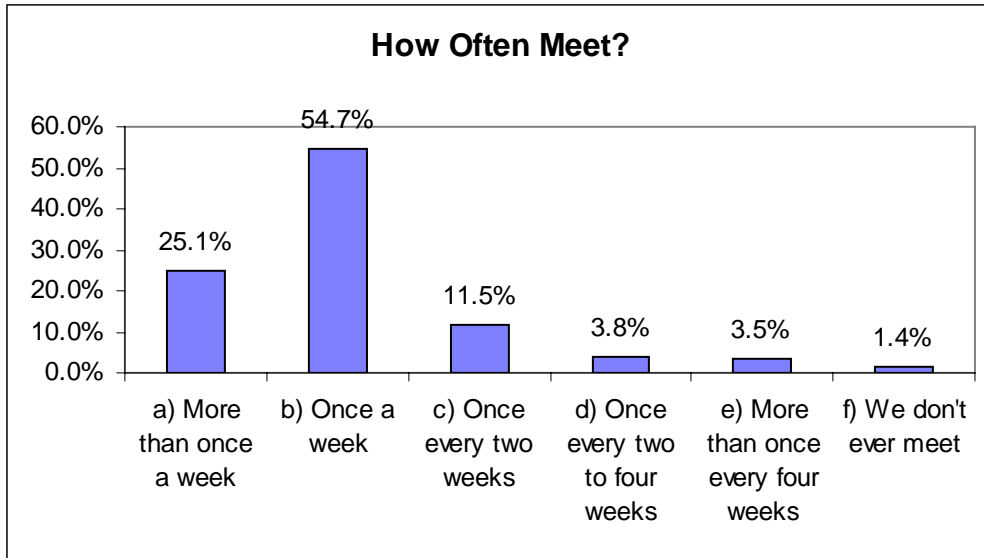
Are you now working on a team?



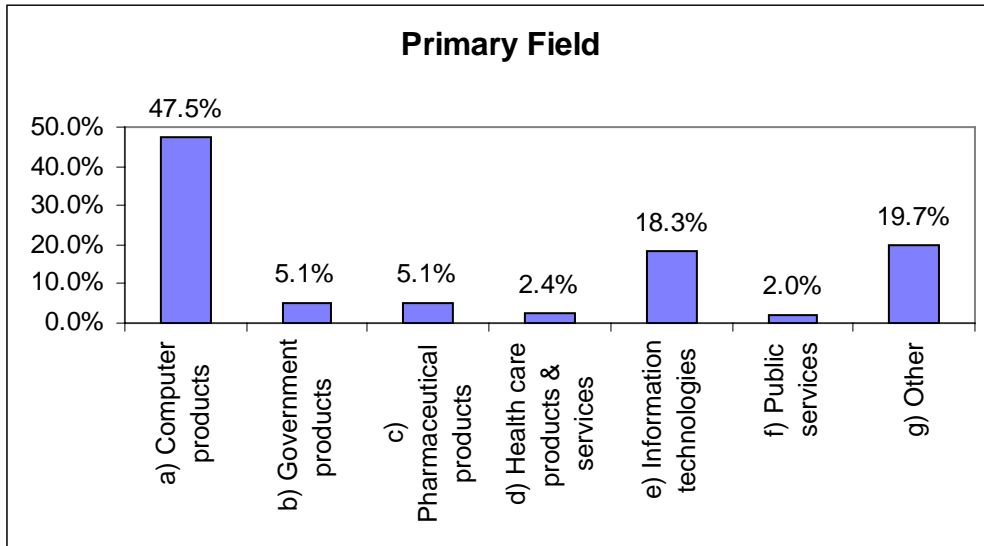
If so, how many people are on your team?



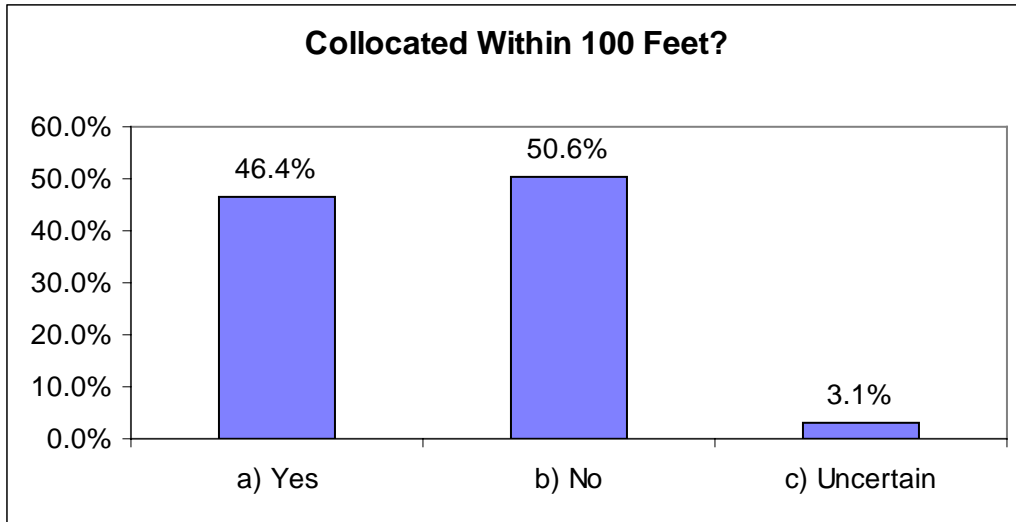
About how many times does your team meet?



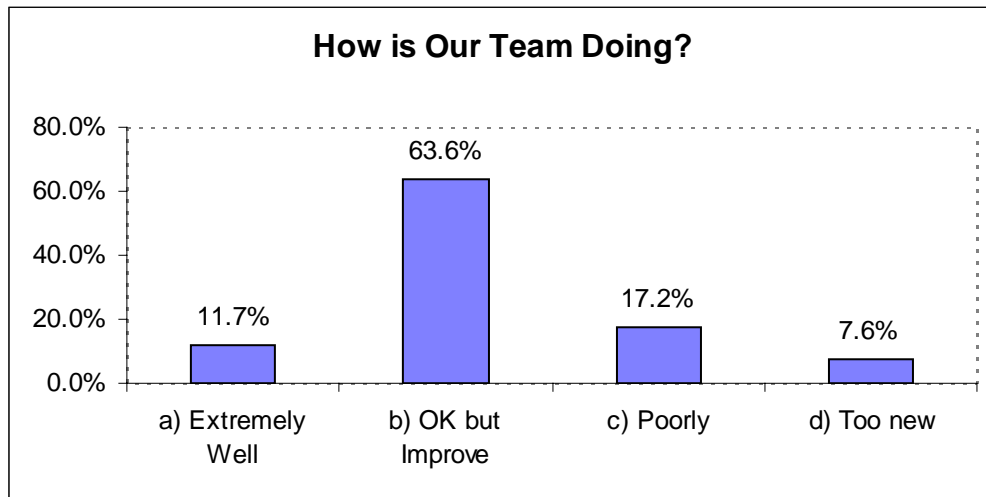
My company's primary field is:



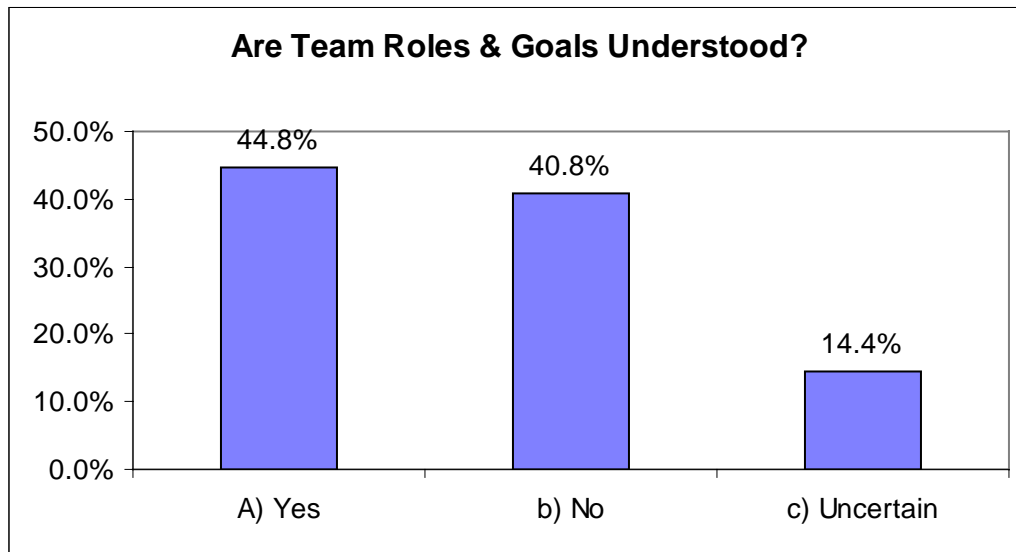
Are all team members located in the same general area (within 100 feet of each other)?



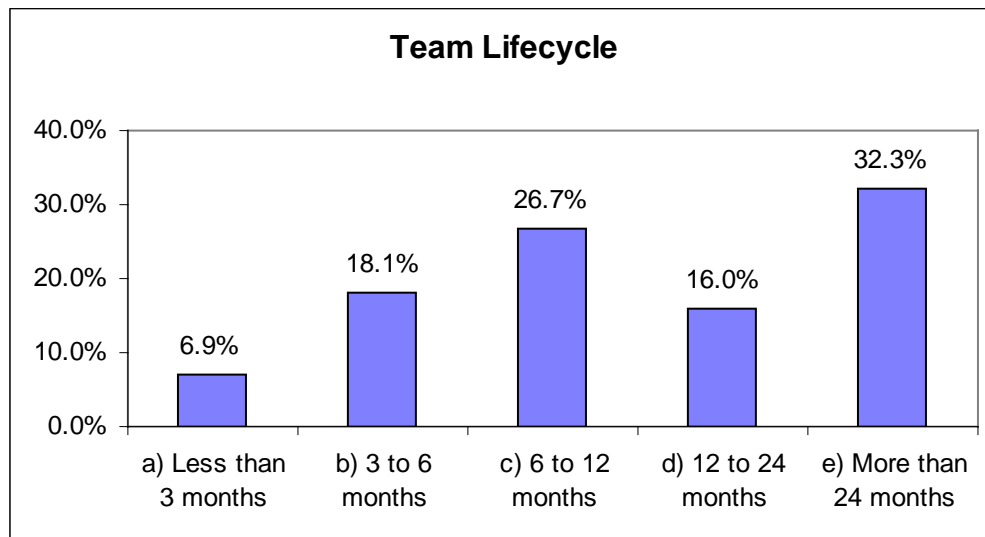
Overall, how is your team doing?



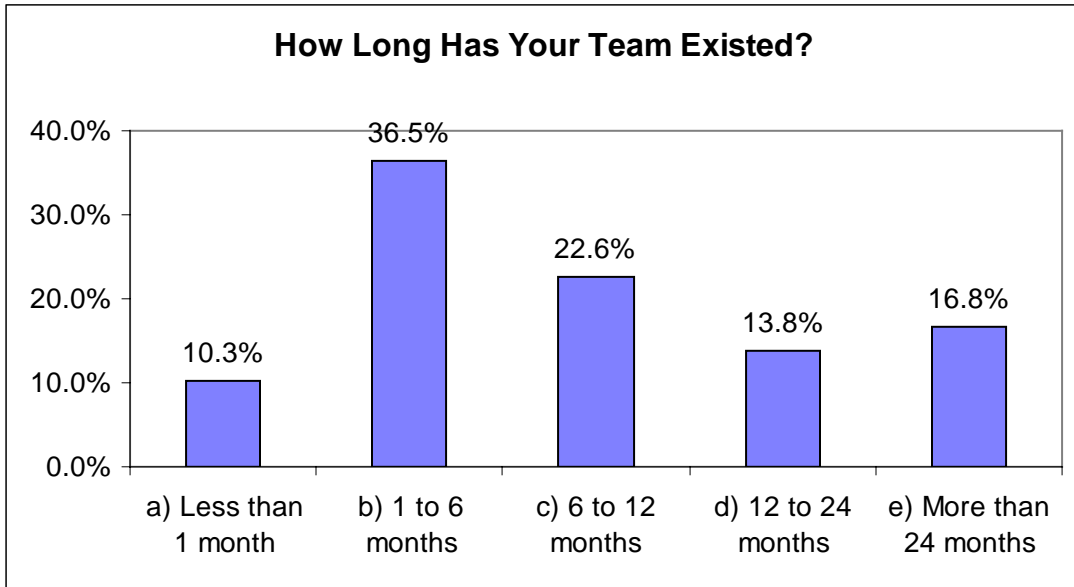
Do you believe the roles and goals of your team are clearly understood by all team members?
